About the Role

Children's Health Defense Australia are seeking highly motivated and skilled individuals to join our team as State Chapter Managers. The successful candidates will be responsible for leading a chapter in the capital city of their state or territory, engaging with community members, and advocating for our organisation's mission and goals. State Chapter Managers are part of a national team and international network of medical freedom advocates all working together with one goal; to end the epidemic of chronic illness in children. As a voluntary role, this position does not offer a salary. However, the State Chapter Managers will have the opportunity to make a significant impact in their local community, build leadership skills, and contribute to making positive changes to children's health worldwide.

Key Responsibilities

- Lead the local state chapter by recruiting, training, and managing volunteers.
- Develop and implement local engagement, advocacy, education, and organisation strategies to benefit the community and align with Children's Health Defense Australia's mission and goals.
- Build relationships with local stakeholders, partners, and community members to support our organisation's initiatives and campaigns.
- Represent our organisation in local events, meetings, and other public forums.
- Collaborate with other state chapter managers and organisation staff to ensure consistent messaging and coordination across chapters.
- Track and report on local chapter activities, progress, and outcomes as well as stay engaged and responsive with the National Chapters Committee and/or the National Chapters Coordinator.
- Attend regular meetings as part of the National Chapters Committee and with other chapter leaders to stay informed about national and international initiatives, best practices, and opportunities for collaboration.
- Ensure that any content or information that your chapter creates & shares is an accurate educational resource, up to date, cited, and referenced.
